

A recap of events during the past week regarding Hanford's tank vapors

From the desk of Mark Lindholm, WRPS President:

It's been a busy couple of weeks at the tank farms. Earlier this month, a federal judge denied a motion for preliminary injunction filed by the Attorney General, Hanford Challenge and Local 598 to implement additional interim protective measures at Hanford's tank farms. The decision recognized WRPS' efforts to put in place "significant protective measures" in line with the Tank Vapor Assessment Team Report recommendations to safeguard employee health.

Also, the Department of Energy Office of Inspector General (OIG) issued its report on chemical vapor exposure concerns at Hanford's tank farms. The OIG review "did not reveal significant issues with regard to the Department's and WRPS' strategy and ongoing actions to address vapor risks." The review team also noted that "Department and WRPS leadership have taken action to improve communication with the workforce on issues pertaining to vapors." WRPS is working to implement the OIG's recommendations, which can be found in the <u>full report</u>.
